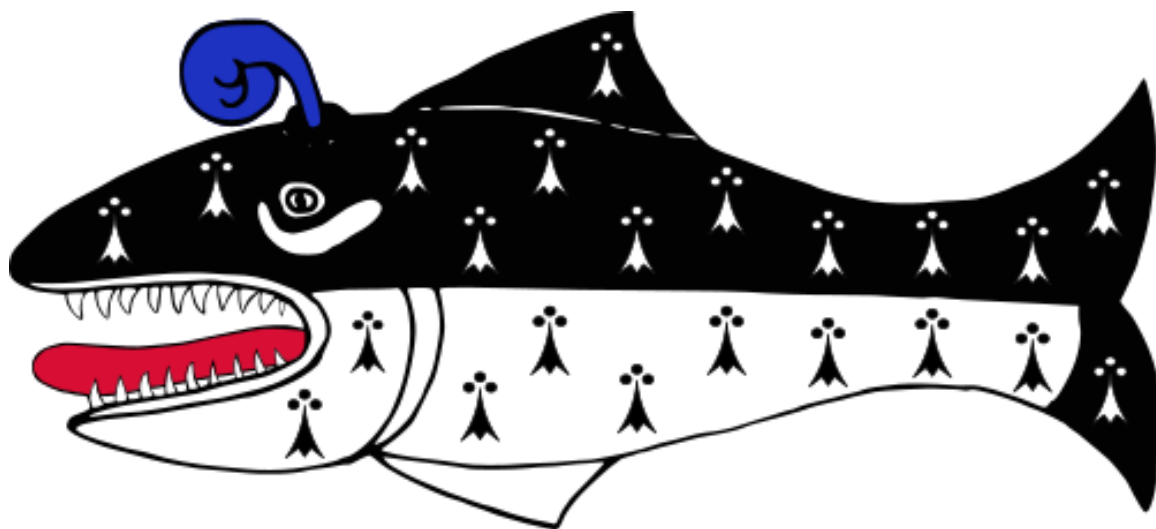

Introduction

This version of the Seagirt Book of Scribe was started late in AS 54 (spring 2020) after the Barony's successful registration of official names and badges for almost all of the Awards & Orders used by the Barony. It builds on previous editions of the Book in various formats, and would not exist at all if not for the work and enthusiasm of the Barony's scribal and heraldic community.

This edition incorporates all of the formally registered award names and award badges that Seagirt registered in 2019/2020. The registered formal name of each award or order is given first, and followed by common names or former names, where those are different from the formal registered name.

It is a living document and will be updated as needed.

Award descriptions (*in italics*) originally from the An Tir Order of Precedence (OP) as of (new date – check stuff!). Some annotations, additions, or questions marked “- V” are added by myself.

Standard/Suggested Wordings

None of these are set in stone but are prompts and suggestions from previous editions of our Book of Scribe, other scribal resources, or previous awards.

Major departures from these suggested wordings should be sent back to the Seagirt Scribe for approval by the Coronets before being committed to an award.

Gender Inclusivity & Pronouns

It is both AS 57 and 2022 CE as I write this and we would be remiss not to address this. Just as we take pains to include the preferred spelling of someone's SCA name on their awards, and incorporate meaningful symbols from their persona, heraldry or chosen background, so do we need to take pains to include their pronouns on awards created for them. “He/she/they” has been used most places throughout the Suggested Wordings here and should be swapped as appropriate.

“Baron & Baroness” has been used throughout as it matches the chosen style of our current Coronets, but “the Coronets”, “the Coronets of Seagirt”, “the Baronage”, “Baron and Baron”, or “Baroness and Baroness” might be used in the future by new holders of the Coronets of Seagirt and award wording should be adapted as needed.

The Baronial Seals



At the start of 2020 Seagirt commissioned a pair of bronze seals from Kings Wax, a local business. We now have a 2" wide Great Seal and a 1" wide Lesser Seal to put on the awards, charters, warrants, and other paperwork that our Coronets might see fit to issue.

If you are a scribe working on something that will have a Seal attached, remember to leave space for either the Great or Lesser Seal.

For the Lesser Seal, leave a roughly circular area **1.25"** wide.

For the Greater Seal, leave a roughly circular area **2.25 to 2.5"** wide.

It is also possible to do various sorts of pendant seals hanging off the bottom of an award or warrant. This is historically accurate for much of our period, looks great, and is not hard to do but does make the award more fragile and can complicate framing. Talk to the Baronial Scribe ahead of time if you want to do this.

Sergeants, Scholars, Courtiers, and Foresters

People earning the ranks of Sergeants, Scholars, Courtiers, or Foresters from the Coronets of Seagirt will usually have an award scroll of some sort created in recognition of the achievement.

For reference, the badges of these four groups are included here.

The Sergeantry traditionally swear fealty to the Baroness, and provide escort, protection, and advice as requested.

The Scholars traditionally swear fealty to the Baron, and provide counsel and advice as requested.

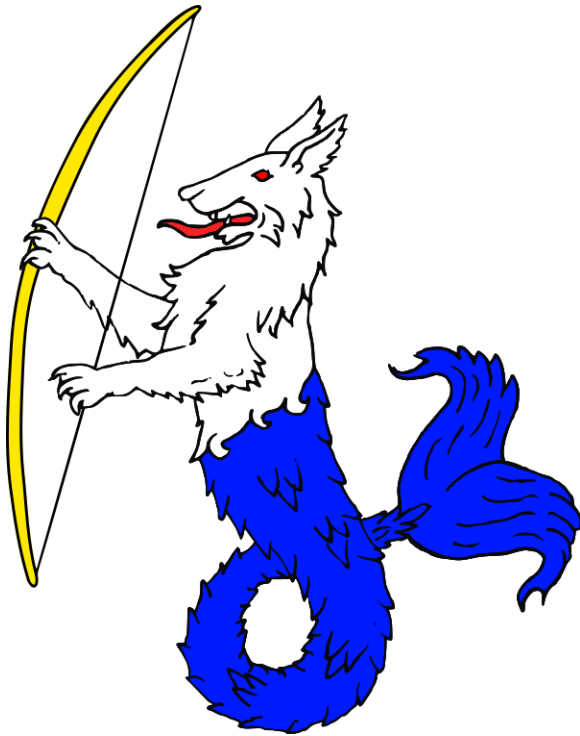
Both the Courtiers and Foresters are new to Seagirt, with no sworn members at this time, and traditions around these orders remain to be created.



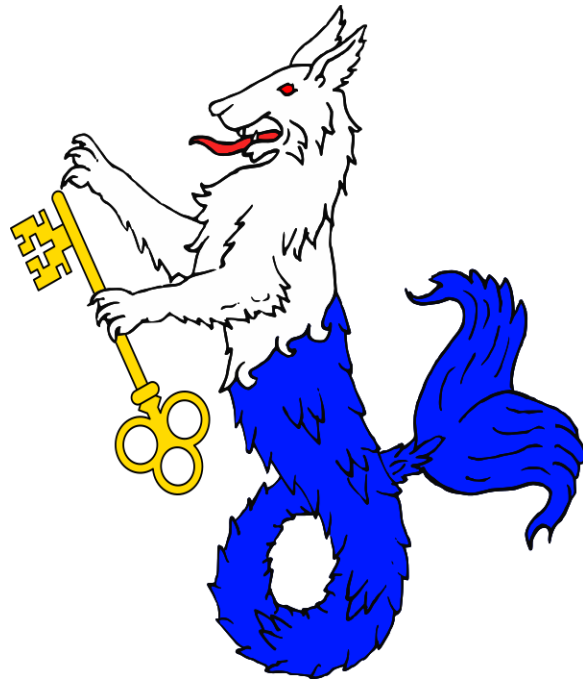
*Badge of the Seagirt Scholars. Blazon: (Fieldless)

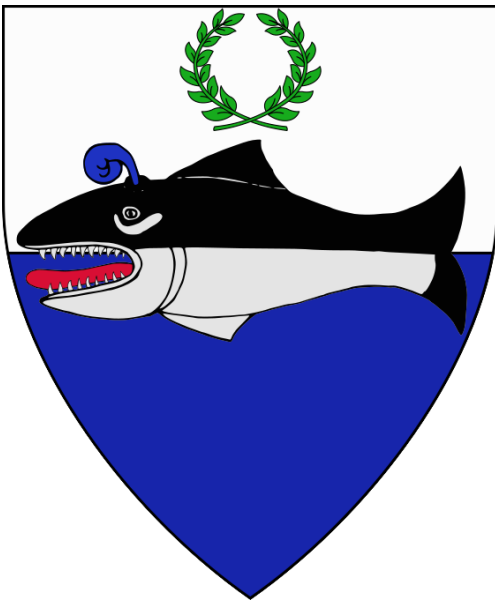
The Heraldry of Seagirt

The Baronial arms can be included on an award if desired, as the award comes from the Baron & Baroness of Seagirt, who have the right to display the arms of Seagirt while they are B&B.

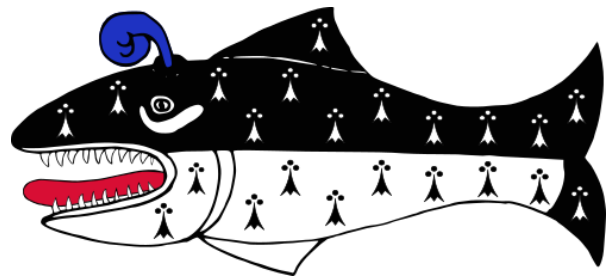
The Ancient Arms are no longer in common use but are still registered to the Barony. They might be appropriate to include on a backlog or replacement scroll for an award given prior to 2019, when the “wiggly whale” was still the arms of the Barony.

The populace badge can be used by anyone resident in or associated with Seagirt and can always be used on an award.

The populace ensign is really intended as a flag, but could be used as part of the decoration of an award.



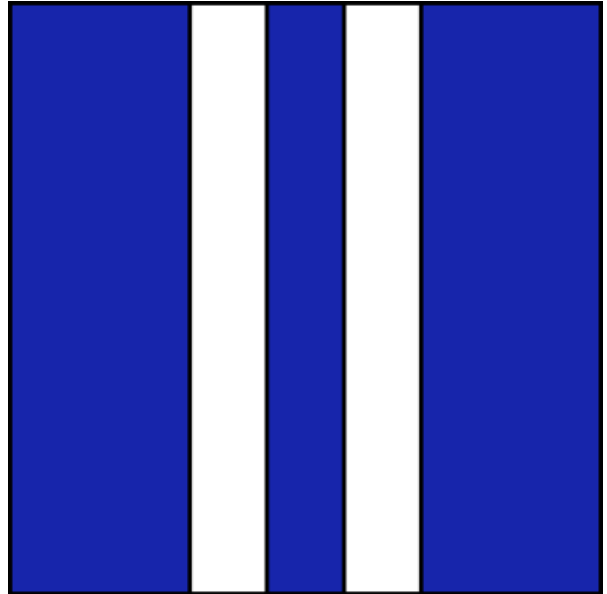

The Duties, Responsibilities, and Privileges of the Baronial Scribe & Signet

You DO not have to be any sort of calligraphic or scribal master to fill this position, but skill with herding scribes and artists and a certain level of organization is needed. Thankfully our Barony has a thriving scribal community to tap!

Broadly, the duties of the Baronial Scribe are:

1. Arrange the creation of such awards, charters, and warrants as Their Excellencies Seagirt request of you. This usually means connecting with the B&B six weeks or so before an event to get names and awards from them, connecting to your scribal group (we have a private FB chat group) to find calligraphers and artists, and arranging for everything to be signed and sealed at or before the event in question. This includes having custody of the two Baronial Seals, which is the *Signet* part of the job.
2. Arrange for charter blanks to come in from Kingdom and Principality, go out to painters, and go back up to Kingdom and Principality painted and ready to be awarded.
3. Encouragement and nourishment of the various scribal arts so that the previous two points are easier and more fun for everyone!

As with other officers, you must be a paid SCA member to hold this position.

It is a Baronial retinue position in fealty to Their Excellencies Seagirt. Close coordination before and during events with Their Excellencies, the Court Coordinating Herald, the Baronial Court Herald, and other members of the Baronial retinue is essential.

You do NOT have to be a paid member to be Deputy Scribe, as far as I know. As with all officers, the Baronial Scribe may take deputies and define their roles as they wish, subject to the approval of the Coronets & Baronial Council/Curia.
